Mental Health and Wellness

The Cobb County Community Services Board (CCCSB) provides mental health services to children, adolescents, and adults. We believe recovery is possible for everyone: it is a long-term process unique to each person.

We offer clinical treatment, mental-illness education for individuals and families, links to community resources, and support for skills development necessary to live the best life possible. Services are guided by the needs and goals of each person and based on each individual's strengths.

Substance Use Disorders

We provide both clinical and non-clinical supports focused on individuals' strengths, encompassing whole health and resiliency. Services are guided by lived experience and supported by a peer workforce.

Behavioral Health Crisis Center

The Behavioral Health Crisis Center (BHCC) offers support to individuals who are in need of a temporary monitored residential stay—providing the opportunity for psychiatric and behavioral stabilization and detoxification.

Child and Adolescent

The CCCSB offers programs that address the social and emotional needs of children and adolescents in mental health and addictive disease recovery. Youth-guided and family-driven programs encourage self-exploration and growth and teach early recovery skills, alternative decision making, coping skills, and age-appropriate life skills. We offer:

- Individual, Group, and Family Counseling
- Group Skills Training and Development
- Case Management
- Resource Coordination
- Bright Changes School Partnerships Program
- Bright Changes Clubhouse (age 9-21) for mental health
- Team Clubhouse (age 13-17) for substance use
- George W. Hartmann Center (long-term residential addictive disease treatment; age 13-17)

Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities

This I/DD program assists individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities to become participating and respected citizens who live, work, contribute and develop relationships within the community. Our service and supports are aimed at promoting personal choice and community inclusion. We offer:

- Habilitative and Therapeutic Services
- Supported/Self-employment
- Day Programs (e.g., art programs, computer labs)
- Family Liaison/Family Supports
- Residential Services (e.g., group homes, semi-independent living, in-home supports)
- Host Homes
