Services at Choices 2 will provide individuals with:

- ◆ **Inclusion** - by involvement with relatives, friends and a sense belonging to their neighborhood and community.
- ◆ **Independence** - by affording individuals with opportunities to develop skills that lessen dependence and promote increased self-esteem.
- ◆ **Individualization** - by being given personalized choices for services in terms of each individuals unique and valued abilities.
- ◆ **Productivity** - by presentation of opportunities to make an increasingly meaningful contribution to their environment.

Individuals receiving services at Choices 2 will have the following rights:

- ◆ Choice - The right to make choices according to a person's personal preference is an important part of the Without Walls (WOW) person-centered approach.
- ◆ Quality Care - Individuals in our program will be treated with respect and dignity.

Services

Our Staff

Choices 2 Direct Support Professionals are trained in over 60 areas of direct care including:

- Positive Behavioral Support
- Crisis Prevention Intervention
- Basic Life Support (CPR)
- NADSP Direct Support Professional Certification Course, Levels 1-3

Community Based Training Center

Staff work with each individual to improve activities of daily life (ADL's) and to enhance the quality of life through exercise, education, volunteerism, arts and crafts, and recreational/leisure activities.

These activities take place in our 10,000 sq. ft. facility. The facility contains 13 classrooms, well-suited for intimate group settings, 7 restrooms, a shower room, a laundry room, a nursing station with 3 beds, and a kitchenette/cafeteria. For added engagement, the Arts & Crafts room is fitted with a kiln and mosaic glass tools. Also, there's an outdoor gardening space available for those with a green thumb!



World Without Walls (WOW)

This program, based in the community,* assists individuals to improve their activities of daily life (ADL's) by enhanced interactions with their peers and community.

Educational Programs Offered Daily

- ◆ Volunteerism
- ◆ Arts and Crafts
- ◆ Travel Training (CCT, MARTA, Street Car)
- ◆ Special outings, at a minimum of once per week, that include fun events such as bowling, a trip to the movies, rock climbing, or shopping

Monday through Friday, individuals try their hands at job skill development, learning financial skills, and basic awareness of what is expected in the workplace.

*Transportation is provided to and from all activities.
