

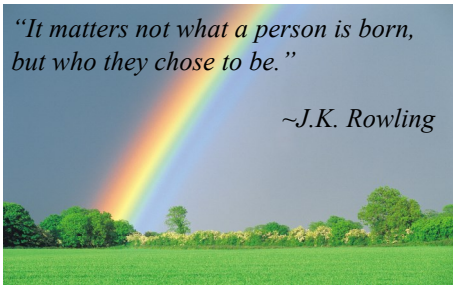
## Individual Rights

### **Program Overview**

Family Supports is considered a financial gap service, where funds are brokered to the families and service providers in order to assist with financial coverage.

Family Supports can financially assist with 26 different services. A few of the most common services are:

- ◆ Incontinence Supplies
- ◆ Respite
- ◆ Community/Social Activities
- ◆ Community Living Supports/ Individual Community Access
- ◆ Summer Camps

### **Eligibility**

- ◆ The individual must have a clinical diagnosis of Intellectual/Developmental disability prior to the age of 22 or a Traumatic Brain Injury prior to the age of 18
- ◆ The individual must be 4 years of age or older
- ◆ The individual must not be receiving a NOW or COMP Medicaid Waiver
