Evening Programs Descriptions

Level 0.5

Provides education on the impact various drugs have on the brain and body; teaches techniques to reframe from relapse; explores the impact of drugs and alcohol on mental illness and its impact on psychotropic and other medications.

Level 1

Provides education on the process of addiction; teaches the difference between dependence and abuse; explores how character and personality traits set up addictive patterns; teaches healthy boundaries and recovery coping skills.

Level 2.1

Teaches the internal journey of recovery through education on the disease of addiction, the recovery process and relapse prevention; focuses on identification of internal and external warning symptoms; education on mistaken beliefs of relapse, stuck points, stress and recovery; teaches skills to go from a life style of addiction to a life style of recovery by developing a plan for ongoing life style change.

Mothers Making A Change Program

MMAC offers comprehensive gender specific substance abuse treatment to pregnant women and/or women with children under the age of 18 who have drug and alcohol related issues.

MMAC provides both outpatient and residential treatment. The residential component is available to women who attend the intensive outpatient program but are unable to maintain sobriety without a structured residential setting.
