### Permanent Supportive Housing

#### *Shelter Plus Care and Supportive Housing Program*

Permanent supportive housing provides a long-term housing option to homeless individuals, and their families, whose mental health, addictive disease, and/or a developmental disability has made it difficult to maintain/establish a permanent residence. The reduced rent ensures that an individual's income is able to provide more than just a roof over their head and is calculated at 30% of the tenant's adjusted gross income.



### Home for Recovery

This grant provides wrap-around services to individuals who are in permanent supportive housing programs and suffer from the diseases of mental illness and are dually diagnosed. This program has services for veterans and civilians.



### Crisis Respite Program

The crisis respite program provides temporary housing to individuals who need additional support to prevent them from going to the hospital or to those who are transitioning out of the hospital back into the community. The program consists of two-bedroom, apartments in a complex located in Marietta, Georgia. The length of stay is not to exceed 30 days. Referrals can be made on the Cobb and Douglas Community Services Board website under Residential Services.
