## Case Management (CM)

### What is Case Management (CM)?

CM is a community-based support service for adults who have severe and persistent mental illness or co-occurring disorder.

### What to Expect

You will meet with your case manager at least twice a month.

Your case manager will work with you to:

- Develop goals for your recovery
- Learn and develop daily living skills
- Coordinate with community resources
- Improve independent functioning

### Services

CM consists of a variety of services to link clients to needed resources and to develop strong independent living skills.

- Assistance with enrollment in benefit programs (such as food stamps, Section 8, or Social Security Disability Insurance)
- Connection to local resources such as food banks, clothing closets, and shelters
- Exploration of long-term housing options
- Linkage to employment and education resources
- Symptom education and management
- Medication management
- Budgeting skills
- Healthy eating and physical exercise
- And more!
